Licensing Act 2003 - Review of Licensing Policy.

Recommendations

1. That the Licensing Acts Committee recommends Council to approve the revised Statement of Licensing Policy.

Purpose of Report

1. To present to the committee a revised Licensing Policy in accordance with the Licensing Act 2003.

Strategic Objectives

2. The proposal contributes to three of the Council's strategic objectives:

Strategic Objective 3: Crime; key aim- Reduce the number of people feeling unsafe after dark and in daylight: The policy actively promotes the reduction of crime and disorder that can be associated with licensable activities.

Strategic Objective 4: Health and Well-Being; key aim- Promote health and well-being: The policy promotes responsible drinking and addresses anti social behaviour that can be associated with poor health and well being.

Strategic Objective 5: Economy; key aim-Promote vibrate towns: The policy supports licensable activities that can assist towns in providing vibrate lifestyle and economy.

Background

- South Oxfordshire District Council is designated as the Licensing Authority under the Licensing Act 2003, and as such is required to produce a licensing policy which must be reviewed every three years. The first policy was adopted on the 16 December 2004 and is required to be reviewed by 16 December 2007.
- 4. There have been no significant changes to the Licensing Act legislation, guidance or local circumstances since the Licensing Policy was first adopted. The revised policy has been amended to take into account new supplementary legislation and remove transitional policies which are no longer required. The policy has been revised in conjunction with relevant authorities and their views have been incorporated into the policy. The revised policy is in Appendix A and the policy changes are highlighted for ease of reference in Appendix B.
- 5. The draft policy was sent out for consultation to all relevant authorities, parish councils and other trade organisations. The consultation period finishes on 12 November 2007 and a list of consultees is in Appendix C. This report was written during the period of consultation, therefore any representation received after this date will be brought to the Licensing Acts Committee on the 22 November 2007.
- 6. The Licensing Statement of Policy has been reviewed in line with statutory guidance and the amendments have been approved by the Oxfordshire Licensing Group and Legal Services.

Financial Implications

7. There are no financial implications.

Legal Implications

8. The Licensing Act places a duty on the Council to review the Licensing Policy every three years. Failure to undertake the review could result in a Judicial Review.

Human Resource Implications

9. There are no human resource implications.

Conclusion

10. By adopting the above proposals the Licensing Statement Policy will comply with the requirements of Licensing Act 2003.
