Audit Commission report on the certification of annual claims and returns (2008/09): update on position.


- 1. At its meeting on 23 March 2010 this committee received a report on the certification of annual claims and returns. At this meeting, Anne Ockleston (Audit Manager Audit Commission) emphasised the large amount of money involved in making claims to grant paying departments and that this was a useful audit for detecting any underlying problems. She drew to councillors' attention the issues arising around housing benefit accuracy although the council was known to be addressing the problems. She referred to the qualification letter in respect of the 2008/09 benefit subsidy claim and advised that it was up to the Department for Work and Pensions (DWP) as to whether they accepted the findings. The Audit Commission was in the meantime undertaking some additional testing on claims, which would result in a further report to the DWP.
- 2. Steve Bishop, Strategic Director, commented on the report acknowledging that it was the first time South Oxfordshire District Council had received a qualification. He acknowledged that this must not happen again but also highlighted that as many as 50 per cent of councils had had their claims qualified during a period where caseloads had risen dramatically. In fact subsequent information received has confirmed that up to 85 per cent of 2008/09 benefit subsidy claims were either qualified, amended or both. He confirmed that the council would implement

all the recommendations in the Audit Commission's report and would address the unacceptable error levels with Capita - with improvements being evident within three months.

- 3. The following is an update on current accuracy performance:
- The good news is that accuracy (based on statutory council checks) rose from an in-month performance of **86.67%** in February 2010 to **90.36%** in June 2010 with the May accuracy rate being the first time Capita had hit >90% accuracy since the inception of the contract. In month performance can be seen in **table 1** below.
- Capita is now checking up to 35% of its daily work and its accuracy figures are also included in table1. As these are usually pre-payment checks, it means more customers are now receiving correct benefit entitlements. This should lead to fewer complaints and improved customer satisfaction.
- On the cumulative front, from Feb 2010 to June 2010 (which was the key period) performance improved from **86.67%** to **88.35%**. This is shown in **table 3** below.
- On the cumulative front for the 2010/11 financial year, performance is currently running at **90.38**%. This time last year it was running at **79.83**%. This is shown in **table 2** below.
- 4. We are still awaiting the DWP's decision on the 2008/09 qualified benefit subsidy claim following the additional work undertaken by the Audit Commission mentioned in 1 above. The penalty could now be anything up to £178,000 (previously estimated at £72,000). Letters of mitigation from Steve Bishop and the leader of the council have been sent to the DWP. The council will claim back any penalty from Capita.
- 5. The latest version of the overarching Benefits Accuracy Action Plan (updated on 14 September) is attached for information. It was introduced to drive up accuracy performance and confirms that task 1 (the recommendations emanating from the Audit Commission's report) has been completed.
- 6. In the meantime the audit of the 2009/10 benefit subsidy claim commenced on 16 August.



1. Benefits accuracy (monthly performance)


