Details of decision required	<ul> <li>To approve the continuation of a strategic partnership with Trust for Oxfordshire's Environment (TOE) following a successful pilot scheme to support community-led biodiversity projects in South Oxfordshire and enter into a grant agreement for 2024/25.</li> <li>To approve the transfer of £56,250 for 2024/25 of Community Infrastructure Levy (CIL) funding from the provisional capital programme to the approved capital budget programme to fund at least three projects delivering new wildlife habitats, tree planting and improved access to the countryside.</li> <li>To transfer £56,250 to TOE subject to the completion of a funding agreement that sets out the assessment criteria for release of funds to applicants and monitoring requirements to the district council.</li> </ul>		
Recommended Action	That the Council continues to support a strategic partnership with TOE to deliver biodiversity and public access projects, fully funded from CIL receipts, and that the budget is transferred from the provisional capital programme to the approved capital programme.		

Reasons for recommended decision	<ul> <li>To meet the council's net zero carbon emission and biodiversity goals, there is an immediate requirement to support nature recovery projects within South Oxfordshire</li> <li>In 2023/24, £56,250 from CIL receipts was allocated to a capital scheme to support a strategic partnership with TOE, delivering</li> </ul>
	community-led biodiversity projects in South Oxfordshire. This included a £50,000 funding pot to be distributed through grants to community organisations, and a 12.5 per cent administration fee of £6,250.
	• A contract between the Council and TOE was signed in July 2023, allowing 12 months to allocate the funding to at least three projects. Within the first six months of the partnership, 90% of the funding has been successfully allocated to six organisations, creating new wildlife habitats and improving access to the countryside. Details of these projects can be found in Appendix 1. Officers anticipate the final sums will be awarded following the next application round to be decided in June 2024.
	• The pilot scheme has already proved to be a success, with projects well distributed throughout the district. Due to TOE's expert assessors and robust processes, Officers are confident that the projects selected will deliver quality outcomes for nature recovery.
	• TOE advises us that they have been working with organisations to help develop a pipeline of new projects ready for funding. The popularity of these funds therefore clearly demonstrates an ongoing need for grants and mentoring to deliver biodiversity and public access projects in South Oxfordshire.
	• New allocations for four more years of funding to support a strategic partnership with TOE (£56,250 each year up to and including 2027/28) were approved at the February council meeting. A new contract will need to be agreed and renewed subject to annual budget approvals and monitoring to ensure the continued successful delivery of the fund.

Alternative options considered and rejected	<ul> <li>Do not commence this project – rejected as this project is a corporate priority for delivery.</li> <li>Use the council's own grants team to administer a £50,000 grant scheme – rejected due to the lack of resources within the Council to facilitate the grants process beyond the basic administration of the scheme, which would necessitate the use of specialist advisors to help develop, evaluate and monitor good quality biodiversity projects within an acceptable timescale.</li> <li>Wait until all funds are allocated before agreeing to further funding – rejected as it is important to maintain continuity for organisations applying for funds and being able to plan ahead when developing new projects.</li> </ul>

Details of the scheme	£56,250, fully funded from CIL, has been included in the provisional capital programme for the next four years to fund a strategic partnership with Trust for Oxfordshire's Environment (TOE). The aim of the scheme is to deliver at least 3 new wildlife habitats, tree planting and countryside access projects per year in South Oxfordshire.
	This annual allocation comprises a £50,000 grant pot to be distributed to community groups in the district, and £6,250 per annum (12.5 per cent of the grant value), to cover TOE's administration fees.
	The contract will be managed by the Climate and Biodiversity Team at South Oxfordshire District Council who will hold regular meetings with TOE representatives to ensure the success of the project.
Strategic objectives	<ul> <li>Protect and Restore Our Natural World</li> <li>Work in partnershipto improve access to green spaces in and around our towns, reinforcing access to nature as a priority for community wellbeing</li> <li>Encourage the use of natural processes to combat risks arising from climate change, such as meadows and trees to reduce flooding.</li> </ul>
	<ul> <li>Action on the Climate Emergency</li> <li>Mitigate climate change through planning and land use, enhancing biodiversity on our own land and strengthening the planning system to enforce environmental standards.</li> </ul>
Purpose of the scheme	Trust for Oxfordshire's Environment (TOE) will be delivering a grant scheme to distribute Community Infrastructure Levy (CIL) funding to biodiversity and access projects in South Oxfordshire.

The capital cost of the scheme	Capital cost of the scheme is £56,250 per annum for four years up to 2027/28.
The profile of that expenditure	<ul> <li>£50,000 funding for a grant scheme administered by TOE in the capital programme, fully funded by CIL. The money will be used to fund a specialist grant scheme to deliver at least 3 projects in South Oxfordshire, creating new wildlife habitats, tree planting and improving access to the countryside.</li> <li>£6,250 (12.5 per cent of the grant funding) to cover TOE's annual administration fees to run a grant scheme in an open, fair and transparent manner, including identification of and mentoring support to suitable projects; the necessary administration and management of the application process that will meet the council's agreed funding criteria; and ensure that the projects awarded grants are effectively delivered.</li> </ul>
